

Garage Door Repair Near Me in Los Angeles

Garage Door Panel and Opener Repair Costs

The cost to repair or change a garage door panel varies according to the material, color, design, insulation, size, and availability of matching replacement parts. A steel garage door may have a different panel price than a wood or composite door. Finding a match for an older door can be challenging if the manufacturer has discontinued the design.
