The restricted airflow also means your evaporator coil receives less air, so it becomes colder and colder as your system desperately tries to move conditioned air through a blocked barrier. This temperature swing forces the compressor to work in conditions it was never designed to handle. What Happens to Compressor Lifespan When Short-Cycling Combines with Airflow Restriction?

Your compressor is the heart of the system, and it is designed to run at a specific frequency under stable conditions. When your filter hasn't been changed in three years and short-cycling begins, the compressor starts and stops dozens of extra times per day instead of running in longer, steadier cycles. Each start event draws a huge inrush of current and creates hydraulic shock inside the refrigerant lines. Over weeks and months, this repeated trauma breaks down the compressor's internal windings, bearings, and valve seats.

A properly sized system with a clean filter might run for 12 to 15 years. An oversized or undersized system trapped in short-cycling mode because of airflow restriction can fail in 2 to 3 years.
