What is Crazy Time?

At its core, Crazy Time is a live dealership game reveal built around a massive, vertically mounted 52-segment wheel. Hosted by charismatic speakers in a vibrant, carnival-themed studio, the video game is transmitted in high-definition with enhanced reality elements flawlessly woven into the gameplay.

The primary goal is simple: gamers put bets on which section the wheel will stop on. However, the inclusion of a Top Slot multiplier in every round-- alongside 4 wildly different bonus games-- elevates it far beyond a conventional wheel-of-fortune game.

Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and bonus offer video games. The numbers pay out even cash or better, while the perk symbols offer gamers entry into the game's heading acts.

Here is how the wheel is dispersed:

- **Number 1:** 21 sections (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 sections (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 sectors (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 segments (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 sections
- **Pachinko:** 2 sectors
- **Cash Hunt:** 2 sections
- **Crazy Time:** 1 segment

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the primary wheel, a two-reel mini fruit machine situated directly above the wheel spins at the same time.

- **Reel 1** display screens a bet spot (either a number or a benefit game).
- **Reel 2** display screens a multiplier (varying from 2x as much as 50x).

If the bet spot and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is used to the corresponding sector on the primary wheel for that round. If the wheel arrive at that sector, all wins for that bet are increased appropriately, setting the stage for enormous payouts.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The true magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time lies in its four interactive bonus offer rounds. These video games transport players out of the studio via CGI and provide the video game's biggest win potential.

1. Coin Flip

The simplest of the bonus offer rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token turned by a machine.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are appointed random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands deal with up awards the player the multiplier connected to that side.

2. Pachinko

Influenced by the conventional Japanese arcade game, Pachinko includes a large physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces randomly down through the pegs until it lands in one of several multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped again for an opportunity at even bigger prizes.

3. Money Hunt

Money Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery game presented on a huge screen with 108 random multipliers concealed behind different signs (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players use an on-screen cannon to intend and contend a symbol of their option before the countdown timer ends. As soon as the timer ends, all gamers reveal the multiplier concealed behind their chosen target. (Note: In automated play, the game selects a target for the player).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme [bitz.io](#) reward round and the hardest to trigger. The host opens a red door, leading gamers into a surreal, brilliantly colored virtual world featuring a huge, 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players need to choose one of three flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the picked flapper points to when the wheel stops is awarded to the gamer.
- **The "Double" and "Triple" sections:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" section, all multipliers on the wheel boost appropriately, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the optimum 20,000 x multiplier can be accomplished.

Pros and Cons of Playing Crazy Time

Like all casino games, Crazy Time comes with its own unique set of advantages and prospective drawbacks.



Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, brilliant visuals, and game-show styling make it incredibly fun to see and play.
- **Massive Win Potential:** With the assistance of the Top Slot and reward round multipliers, wins can reach up to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time require (or replicate) gamer involvement, adding a layer of engagement not discovered in standard slots.
- **Social Atmosphere:** The integrated live chat enables players from worldwide to commemorate wins together.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a large part of the wheel's payout capacity is tied to perk rounds, droughts can rapidly drain a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While standard number bets have a reasonably decent Return to Player, betting specifically on benefit rounds usually brings a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Busy:** Rounds happen rapidly, which can cause overspending if players do not manage their bankrolls thoroughly.

Standard Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a game of pure possibility dictated by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, gamers typically utilize wagering techniques to handle danger and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or the majority of the segments (numbers and benefit games) ensures you rarely miss a spin, though the cost of covering the board can exceed the smaller sized payments.
- **Bonus Chasing:** Focusing specifically on the perk rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward technique considering that bonus rounds take place on just 9 of the 52 sections.
- **Statistical Betting:** Relying on the game's history tracker. Some gamers like to bank on sections that have not hit in a long period of time (the "hot/cold" misconception), though past spins statistically have no bearing on future results.

Crazy Time has actually truly earned its track record as a pioneer in live dealership entertainment. By combining the classic charm of a tv game show with modern-day digital graphics and massive payout potential, Evolution Gaming has actually developed an experience that attract both casual gamers and high rollers alike.
