Valve presented weapon cases to CSGO, however third-party sites took the concept further. <https://cs2skin.com/> Users can open virtual cases with established chances. **Case Battles** take this a step further: two or more gamers purchase into the exact same cases, open them all at once, and whoever pulls the highest total skin value wins all the products from both gamers.

4. Coinflip

An easy, high-stakes game of possibility. 2 gamers wager equivalent skin values, a virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the pot (minus a little house charge).
