Mil-Spec (Blue)	Pistols, SMGs	79.92%
Restricted (Purple)	Assault rifles, shotguns	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	Rifles, submachine guns	3.20%
Covert (Red)	High-tier rifles	0.80%
Rare Special Item (Gold)	knives, gloves	0.10%

Note: The exact percentages can differ slightly from one case to another, but the hierarchy remains constant.
