

A truck windshield does more than keep rain off the dash. It is part of the vehicle's safety system, and that is easy to forget until a crack spreads across the driver's view or a rock chip turns into a line overnight. The glass helps protect occupants from wind, water, and road debris. In many vehicles, it also helps with passenger airbag deployment, helps prevent intrusion during a crash, and contributes to roof support in a rollover.
