As the table illustrates, the odds of pulling a Covert item are less than 1%, and the odds of protecting a rare Special item (a knife or a set of gloves) hover around a weak **0.26%**-- roughly a 1-in-385 opportunity per case.

The Economics of Unboxing: Expectation vs. Reality

It is essential to view CS2 unpacking through the lens of home entertainment rather than investment. Mathematically, the Expected Value (EV) of opening a standard CS2 case is unfavorable.

When a player opens a case, the large majority of the time, they will receive a Mil-Spec or Restricted skin that deserves substantially less than the £ 2.50 key used to open it.

- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look unbelievable even at higher wear values, while others look greatly battered. Understanding how float worths effect price is important if you intend to trade or sell your unboxed products.

3. Think About Buying Directly
