Case Opening	Imitates the in-game case opening experience, however typically on third-party websites with custom-curated chances and higher-tier reward pools. Very variable; usually prefers your home heavily.	
Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP game where two gamers wager skins of roughly equivalent worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Jackpot	Multiple players contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's worth determines the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner selects one winner who takes everything. Based upon the overall value contributed; platform takes a portion fee.	

Features of Modern CSGO Casinos
