As the table illustrates, players have approximately a 1 in 400 possibility of unboxing a Gold item (Knives or Gloves). In addition, within each tier, there is an extra coin toss relating to whether the item is available in **StatTrak™** condition (which tracks eliminates), taking place at a rate of 10% for any offered drop.

Exterior Wear and Float Values

Unboxing a skin is just half the fight. Every weapon dropped from a case is appointed a **Float Value**-- a number between 0.00 and 1.00 that dictates the physical wear and tear of the weapon.

The outside conditions are categorized into 5 distinct tiers:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07

- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look pristine even at greater float worths, while others look greatly battered. Furthermore, particular high-tier knives and weapon patterns are greatly affected by "Pattern [CS2 cases trade](#) Templates," making particular variations extremely uncommon and valuable to collectors.

Strategies and Best Practices for Case Openings

1. Set a Strict Budget
