Why Do Players Use CS2 Casinos?

- **Trade Hold Penalties:** Implemented a 7-day trade hold on products traded through the Steam neighborhood market and peer-to-peer trades, making immediate gambling deposits and withdrawals more troublesome.
- **Stop and Desist Letters:** Valve has actually regularly released legal cautions to significant skin gambling operators, forcing lots of high-profile sites to shut down or relocate.
