4. Jackpot

Several players toss skins into a typical pot. The value of each gamer's skins identifies their portion opportunity of winning the whole pool. A virtual spinner picks the winner, meaning a gamer who transferred a low-value skin still has a possibility-- albeit a little one-- to win whatever.
