3. Diversify Your Case Selection

Prevent dumping your whole budget into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Instead, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a few high-variance cases to stabilize the risk.

4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable overall value wins) turns basic reasoning on its head. While it can be fun, it relies entirely on hitting low-cost, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with basic case-opening logic.
