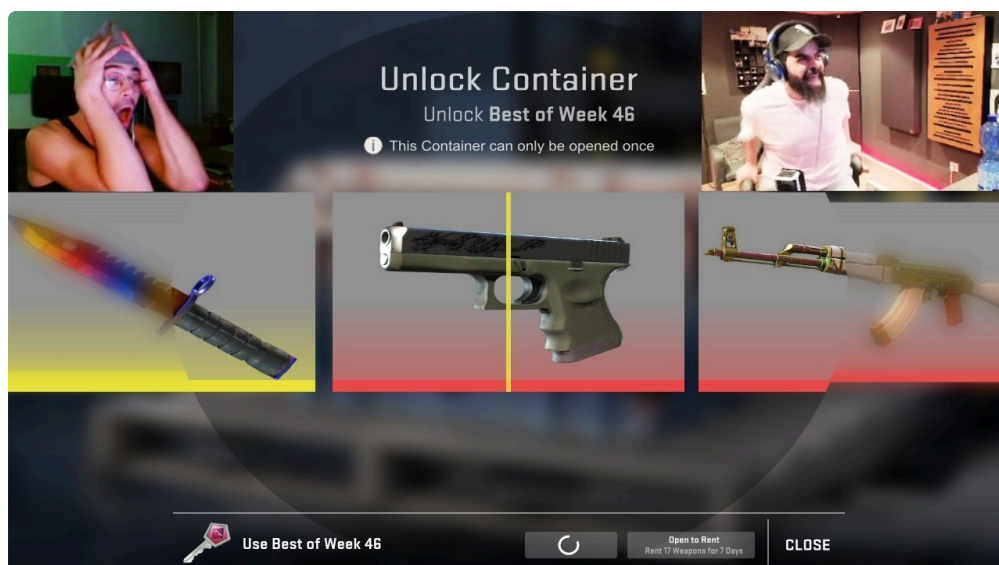

* Rare drop rate refers to the likelihood of getting a "Covert" (red) or "Classified" (pink) skin. Mil-Spec (blue) products make up the bulk of the drops.
