- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the objective of claiming massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This works just like playing the lotto.
