

The four primary electrical hazards—overloaded circuits, faulty wiring connections, ungrounded outlets, and defective panels—create direct negligence liability for property owners who ignore them. This is a basis for claim denial: the insurance company will contend that you failed to upgrade the system to current code standards, thereby assuming the liability yourself. Moreover, in some states, knowingly renting or occupying a property with ungrounded circuits can trigger code violation penalties against the homeowner. Electrician dispatched; travel costs or minimum service fee typically apply.



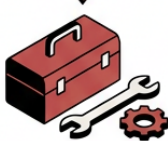
3. On-Site Assessment
