For specific cases that are no longer in the active drop pool, gamers turn to the Steam Community Market. Rates change based on supply and demand.

3. Third-Party Trading Platforms

Lots of traders utilize trustworthy third-party sites to purchase and offer cases utilizing real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrencies, typically bypassing the Steam Wallet funds restriction.

CS2 Case Drop Pools

- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item (Knives/ Gloves):** ~ 0.26%
