1. Memento AWP|Dragon Lore (Cobblestone)

Arguably the most popular skin in Counter-Strike history, the Dragon Lore from the Cobblestone collection stays a titan. - **Tier 1 Blue Gems:** Skins that feature almost 100% solid blue on the topside of an AK-47 or the playside of a Karambit. Because these particular pattern indexes are remarkably rare, collectors are ready to pay huge sums for them.

3. Factory New M4A4|Shout

The M4A4 Howl is an unique abnormality in CS2. Following a copyright disagreement shortly after its release in 2014, Valve eliminated the skin from the *Huntsman Collection* and altered its rarity tier from Covert to "Contraband." No more Howls will ever be dropped or unboxed, making every existing unit a fixed possession in the economy.

What Drives Skin Rarity?

Rarity isn't practically the color of the text in a gamer's stock. 3 main mechanics determine how uncommon-- and important-- a specific weapon finish really is.

- **Drift Values (Wear Rating):** CS2 skins vary from *Factory New* (0.00 to 0.07) to *Battle-Scarred* (0.45 to 1.00). Some skins are "float topped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, making the most affordable possible float for that skin incredibly unusual.
- **Pattern Templates:** As seen with the Case Hardened or Fade surfaces, the seed number dictates how the texture is mapped onto the 3D design. Certain uncommon patterns create visually pleasing or symmetrical designs.
- **Trade-Up Contract Outcomes:** High-tier skins are typically restricted by what ingredients can be fed into a Trade-Up Contract. Getting specific hidden skins through trade-ups requires running the risk of several expensive classified products.
