1. Steam Community Market (SCM)

- **Pros:** Direct integration with the video game; secrets are immediately delivered to your inventory.
- **Cons:** Prices are set by the community and may be higher throughout high-demand durations.

2. Licensed Third-Party Retailers

- **Pros:** Often offer discounted rates, bulk packages, and occasional promos.
- **Cons:** You must confirm the site's legitimacy; some resellers operate gray-market schemes.

3. In-Game Store (for choose cases)

- **Pros:** Simple transaction using Steam Wallet funds.
- **Cons:** Limited selection; not all case keys are readily available for direct purchase.

4. Trade Offers

- **Pros:** Can obtain secrets by trading undesirable skins.
- **Cons:** Requires settlement and trust in the trading partner.

Tips for Buying and Using Case Keys
