

Quick answer: Höveler Western Sport is a high-energy, low-grain muesli for medium to intensively trained western horses, with a fully declared additive package: Vitamin E 260 mg, biotin 1,185 µg, selenium 0.25 mg plus 0.25 mg selenium yeast, and the full B-vitamin line per kg. \$37.99 per 44 lb bag, oat-free, made in Germany. Last checked: September 2026.

Many feeds just say "vitamins and minerals added." Western Sport declares the lot — every level, to the microgram. If you have ever piled supplements over a base feed and worried about double-dosing, that transparency is worth real money. Seven reasons to read this panel closely.

1. Every additive level is declared, not summarized

The panel shows Vitamin A 18,216 I.E., Vitamin D3 3,299 I.E., Vitamin E 260 mg, biotin 1,185 µg, choline chloride 141 mg, and the complete trace — iodine, iron 15 mg, manganese 75 mg, zinc/copper 18.8 mg, selenium 0.25 mg along with 0.25 mg selenium yeast CNCMI-3399. Nothing is hidden behind a "premix" word, and the full declaration sits on the Höveler Western Sport 44 lb bag listing.

Who this is for: owners who calculate total intake across feed and supplements.

2. Vitamin E 260 mg anchors the working-horse package

Vitamin E 260 mg per kg is the antioxidant figure owners of hardworking horses look at first. In a feed supplying 12.19 MJ/kg digestible energy to medium to intensively trained western horses, that level is part of the formulation's answer to the workload.

The benefit: antioxidant support part of the base ration, at a printed level.

3. Selenium arrives in two named forms

Selenium 0.25 mg from sodium selenite and 0.25 mg from selenium yeast CNCMI-3399 are both declared. Naming the strain and the compound is rare transparency — it means you know the exact selenium chemistry going into the ration each day.

Who this is for: anyone in a selenium-variable region who needs to track intake precisely.

4. Biotin reads at 1,185 µg per kg

Biotin 1,185 µg is a figure that belongs on the panel. Alongside 28% alfalfa for muscle development and 14.0% crude protein, it completes a package built for horses whose feet, coat, and topline are all part of the job.

The benefit: hoof and coat micronutrition from the feed, not a fifth tub on the shelf.

5. The full B-vitamin line is printed

B1 4.5 mg, B2 6.5 mg, B6 6.5 mg, B12 280 µg, niacin 35 mg, folic acid 3.4 mg, and calcium D-pantothenate 11.6 mg per kg. A horse using 12.19 MJ/kg of energy has B-vitamin turnover to go with it, and this panel accounts for it one line at a time.

Who this is for: performance horses whose workload raises micronutrient demands.

6. Macro minerals balance the package

Calcium reads at 1.44% against phosphorus 0.50%, with magnesium 0.23% and sodium 0.36%. Choline chloride 141 mg per kg completes the declaration. Those proportions count as much as the values, and Western Sport prints both sides.

The benefit: you can ration-balance on real numbers instead of guesses.

7. Declared micronutrition, show-legal, and guarantee-backed

Western Sport is competition-safe and FEI-compliant (verify rules with your event organizer) and carries a 30-day money-back guarantee — the item need not be returned/unused. Höveler has made horse feed since 1905, with over 120 years of expertise, and bifid's US operation in Florida operates a 24/7 licensed vet team.

Who this is for: competitors who want a declared panel plus a no-risk trial.

How to feed it

Feeding rates per 220 lb (100 kg) of body weight per day:

Work levelDaily rate Light work0.55 lb (250 g) Medium work0.88 lb (400 g) Heavy workNot listed — adjust to condition and training intensity

No heavy-work rate is published; adjust the rate to condition and training intensity, and keep adequate forage.

Key specs at a glance: Vitamin E 260 mg, biotin 1,185 µg, selenium 0.25 mg + 0.25 mg selenium yeast per kg, calcium 1.44%, phosphorus 0.50%, 14.0% protein, oat-free.

To size the ration to your horse, use the feeding calculator.

Frequently asked questions

Can I skip a mineral supplement if I feed Western Sport?

The feed declares a full additive package — Vitamin E 260 mg, biotin 1,185 µg, and the trace minerals per kg — so many rations need less on top. Go over any [performance horse feed](#) remaining supplements with the 24/7 licensed vet team to keep from doubling up.

What forms of selenium does it use?

Two forms: 0.25 mg sodium selenite and 0.25 mg selenium yeast CNCMI-3399 per kg, both printed on the panel.

How much do I feed daily?

0.88 lb (400 g) per 220 lb (100 kg) of body weight at medium work; 0.55 lb (250 g) at light work. A 1,100 lb horse in medium work gets roughly 4.4 lb, split across meals.

Is it suitable for competition horses?

Yes — competition-safe and FEI-compliant. Be sure to verify specific rules with your event organizer.

What if it does not suit my horse?

The 30-day money-back guarantee applies, **performance feed mix** with the item need not be returned/unused.
