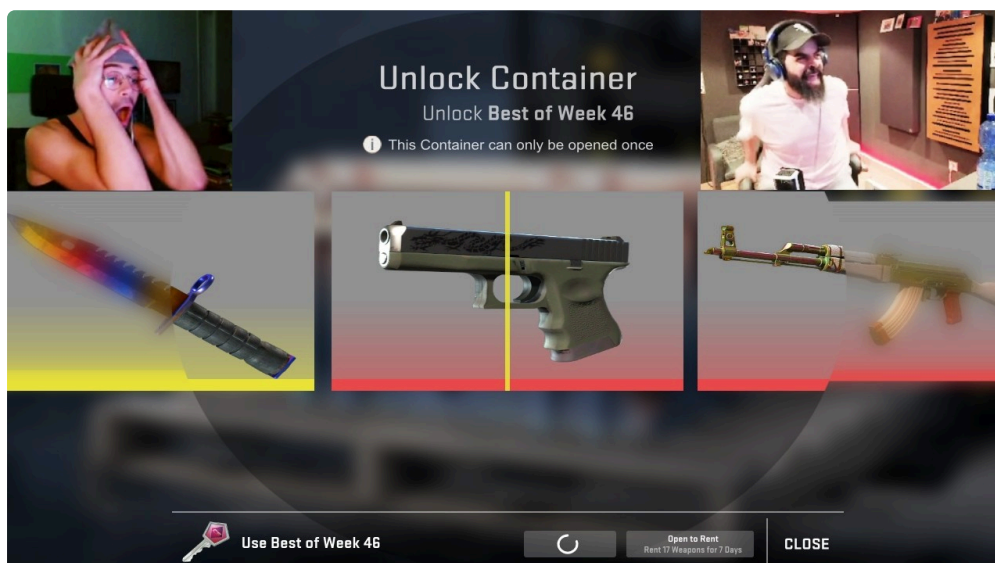
5. Often Asked Questions (FAQ)
