

An automatic garage door should lift and lower smoothly, with both sides moving at almost the same speed. If the door opens at an angle, shakes, stalls, or appears to lean, the problem may involve the springs, lift cables, garage door rollers, tracks, hinges, or the opener. Uneven movement is not simply an annoyance: it can place excessive stress on the door and create a major safety hazard.

Before attempting garage door repair, find out whether the problem is a simple alignment issue or a failure involving a loaded spring or cable. Homeowners can perform a few basic and operational checks, but repairs involving springs, cable drums, and lift cables should generally be handled by a qualified local technician.

What Unbalanced Garage Door Movement Looks Like

Uneven movement can present itself in several ways. One side of the overhead garage door may start lifting before the other, causing the door to lift unevenly. The door may bind in one section, pause during travel, drag against the garage door tracks, or make a sharp popping and grinding sound. A noisy garage door may also wobble as it travels or require repeated opener cycles to shut fully.

Watch the door while it moves from a clear position several feet away. Look for a gap that changes between the door and the tracks, rollers that spring out of their guides, or door sections that stop matching up. A damaged garage door panel can warp the entire assembly and make the door appear uneven even when the opener is working properly.

The garage door opener may also be mistakenly identified as the cause. An opener provides movement through the drive system, but it does not normally resolve a door that is out of balance. If the door moves unevenly when operated manually, the issue is likely related to the hardware rather than electrical. Continuing to use the opener can increase damage to the tracks, rollers, and motor.

Typical Causes of an Uneven Garage Door

The main causes include a failing garage door spring, loose or frayed lift cables, damaged garage door rollers, bent garage door tracks, worn hinges, and worn sections. A door can also become uneven when hardware shifts over time or when the track alignment changes after an impact.

Los Angeles conditions can increase gradual wear. Coastal humidity and salt air may worsen corrosion around hardware and springs, while heat in the San Fernando Valley and inland areas can dry out lubricant and stress rubber components. A torsion spring is mounted above the door and operates alongside a shaft and cable drum. Extension spring systems are usually positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretch as the door operates. Both systems store considerable energy. Attempting to adjust, remove, or replace either type without the correct tools and training can cause severe injury.

Garage door rollers can split, seize, or develop flattened areas. Worn rollers may shake, jerk, or bind as they pass through a curve. Nylon rollers can degrade with age, while metal rollers may become noticeable if bearings wear out or lubrication is not maintained.

Inspect visible hinges, brackets, and fasteners for shifting, missing parts, or loose bolts. Garage door hinges connect the door sections and can allow the sections to bend during travel. However, do not loosen track brackets or spring-related hardware to check a possibility. Track alignment often requires careful measurement, and an incorrect adjustment can make the door unsafe.

A Damaged Panel or Misaligned Door Sections

A garage door panel may be damaged by a vehicle, sports equipment, wind, or an impact near the bottom of the door. Damage to one panel can prevent the door sections from moving properly as they travel around the tracks. Cracks, separated joints, crushed edges, and visible warping are signs that the panel may be adding to the problem.

Door sections must remain properly connected and supported. If one section is sagging, the hinges may be damaged or the fasteners may have pulled away from the material. In some cases, panel replacement returns the door to normal operation. The correct solution depends on the door’s age, design, insulation, color, and availability of compatible replacement components.

When several sections are damaged, the door is badly corroded, or the design is discontinued, full garage door replacement may be more practical. Compare the repair estimate with the expected garage door replacement cost, including removal, disposal, new hardware, and installation.



Cautious Inspections Homeowners Can Perform

Begin with a thorough inspection while the door is closed. Inspect for gaps in the spring, loose or frayed cables, bent tracks, missing rollers, damaged hinges, broken panels, and objects blocking the travel path. Do not place your hands between door sections or underneath the door.

A manual lift test can help identify a balance issue, but only perform it if the door is closed and there is no visible broken spring or frayed cable. Pull the emergency release cord to disconnect the garage door opener, then carefully lift the door by its handles. A properly balanced door should move steadily and remain near the halfway position with limited effort. If it drops, rises rapidly, feels extremely heavy, or moves crookedly, stop the test and arrange expert service.

After testing, close the door fully before reconnecting the opener. Keep children and pets away from the opening. Check the photo-eye sensors near the floor on both sides of the door. They should face each other, remain mounted at the same height, and have clean lenses. Misaligned photo-eye sensors usually cause a door to reverse rather than move unevenly, but they are an important part of garage door safety.

Do not pull the emergency release cord while the door is open unless a professional has confirmed that it is safe. A door with a broken spring or failed cable may fall when disconnected from the garage door opener.

When You Should Stop Using the Door and Contact a Professional

Stop operating the door at once if you see a broken garage door spring, a frayed lift cable, a cable that has come off the cable drum, a door that is hanging at an angle, or a track that has pulled away from the wall. Also stop if the door slams down, will not stay open, makes loud popping sounds, or becomes suddenly much heavier.

A garage door repair technician can make safe the door, determine the failed component, and carry out a safety inspection. Spring systems and cables are under high tension, and improvised repairs can harm the opener or cause the door to collapse. Avoid forcing the door with a vehicle, using ropes as a substitute for cables, or removing spring brackets.

For garage door safety, keep the door closed until service arrives when possible. Tell the technician exactly what happened, whether the door was struck, and whether the uneven movement began gradually or suddenly. These details can help differentiate a worn component from an alignment or structural issue.
