- In a 19-litre body of water, chemical modifications occur much faster than in a 100-litre tank.

- If a fish overeats or a plant decomposes, the ammonia and nitrate levels can spike precariously in a matter of hours.
- Water specifications (temperature and pH) vary more rapidly.

3. What Can Live in a 18.9-Litre Aquarium?

Due to the fact that of the minimal volume, equipping a 19-litre tank needs mindful preparation. You can not keep big fish, nor can you keep schooling fish that require long swimming spaces.

Here is what **can** comfortably live in a 5-gallon/ 19-litre tank:



- **A Single Betta Fish (Siamese Fighting Fish):** A 19-litre tank is widely thought about the *gold standard* minimum size for a single male or female Betta. It provides them adequate room to explore, especially if planted densely.
- **Freshwater Shrimp:** Cherry shrimp, Amano shrimp, and crystal shrimp grow in nano tanks. You can comfortably keep a colony of 10 to 15 shrimp in 19 litres, as their bioload (waste production) is incredibly low.
- **Nerite or Mystery Snails:** Snails make fantastic clean-up teams. A single nerite snail will help keep algae under control.
- **Nano Fish Species:** Very few fish species are suitable for a tank this size. Endler's livebearers (males only, to avoid overbreeding) or *Microdevario kubotai* (emerald dwarf rasbora) *can* work, however only if the aquarist is skilled and maintains strenuous water quality.

What NOT to Put in a 19-Litre Tank

To ensure animal welfare, prevent keeping the following species in a 5-gallon aquarium:

- **Goldfish:** Goldfish produce huge amounts of waste and grow far too big. They require at least 75+ litres for a single expensive goldfish.
- **Tetras, Danios, or Barbs:** These are schooling fish. To be happy, they require to be kept in groups of six or more and require horizontal swimming area (at least a 38-litre/ 10-gallon tank).
- **Plecostomus (Pleco):** Even the smaller sized types (like the Bristlenose Pleco) outgrow a 19-litre tank rapidly.

4. Vital Equipment for a 19-Litre Tank

Establishing an 18.9-litre aquarium requires specific gear reduced to nano percentages.

- **Filtration:** You will need a little, adjustable hang-on-back (HOB) filter or a sponge filter rated for approximately 20 or 30 litres. Make sure the flow rate isn't too strong, as fish like Bettas resist heavy currents.
