4. Preparing Your Baby

Preparation starts days before. Schedule the session around nap time. But not too full—they'll be eating cake. Give them a small cupcake to play with. Dress them in clothes you don't mind ruining. Babies have short attention spans. Bring favorite toys or a familiar blanket. Your baby picks up on your energy. Have wipes and paper towels ready. Gently guide their hand to the cake. Don't force it. Not a perfect performance



5. Getting the Perfect Shot

You want to capture the magic. This creates a more intimate and engaging image. Use a fast shutter speed. From curiosity to delight to full-on chaos. Focus on the eyes. The cake crumbling between fingers. The first taste. If indoors, position the baby near a window. Variety makes for a better album. If you're hiring a photographer, communicate your vision. Consider a "before and after" shot. The best photos are candid and unposed. And don't forget to get in a few photos yourself

6. Keeping Your Sanity

A cake smash is messy by design. This makes cleanup a breeze. Or one you don't mind getting dirty. Dress the baby in a diaper or a onesie you can toss. You'll need them constantly. This calms the baby and cleans them up. But it's good to know in advance. A patio or a park with a picnic blanket. Don't stress about the mess. And you'll laugh about the chaos later. It's a sign of a good time

7. Keeping It Safe

Safety first—always. Check with your pediatrician. Choose a recipe that's free of these if needed. Read labels carefully. Honey is not safe for babies under 12 months. Stick to soft frosting and cake. Some parents prefer a banana or applesauce cake. If your baby has a known allergy. Frosting can cause irritation. Cold cake is harder to smash. A safe cake smash is a happy cake smash



8. When to Do It

Choose the right moment. Schedule the smash for after a nap. Babies are fresh and alert. A [Kollysphere Events](#) full baby won't be interested in cake. 15–20 minutes max. If you're doing a professional session. Natural light is best. If you're doing it at home, block out enough time. Have a backup plan. A tired or cranky baby won't enjoy it. And you might not get the same quality. If photography is important to you, hire a pro. Hire a photographer for a mini-session. And what fits your budget. However you choose to do it

10. What to Do with the Photos

Now what?. First, clean up the mess. Back them up to the cloud. Edit them if needed. Create a photo album or scrapbook. But respect your child's privacy. Order prints for grandparents. This becomes a treasured keepsake. Or save the outfit and a small piece of the cake. What did your baby do?. These details fade over time. And with these tips, you'll have beautiful memories to last a lifetime
