3. Factory New M4A4|Growl

The M4A4 Howl is an unique abnormality in CS2. Following a copyright disagreement shortly after its release in 2014, Valve removed the skin from the *Huntsman Collection* and changed its rarity tier from Covert to "Contraband." No more Howls will ever be dropped or unboxed, making every existing system a fixed possession in the economy.

What Drives Skin Rarity?

Rarity isn't just about the color of the text in a player's stock. Three primary mechanics determine how uncommon-- and <https://cs2skin.com/cases/valuable>-- a particular weapon finish genuinely is.
