- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is put down, the new glass is pressed gently into location, and glazier's points are driven in to protect it.
- **Action 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is applied around the border of the glass, smoothed out, and delegated cure before painting.
