Platform and Language Support Deep Dive

Platform Support

Suprmind operates through a **web platform**, accessible via modern browsers. This makes adoption frictionless, as there is no need for installing specialized software or hardware. However, the vendor's materials currently do not clarify if progressive web app (PWA) capabilities are planned or if offline mode support will be available. Language Support

API Coming Soon: What to Expect
