- **Live roulette:** Similar to traditional casino live roulette, however normally adjusted with three colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green), where Green uses an enormous payment due to lower odds.
- **Coinflip:** A classic 1v1 video game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip identifies the sole winner.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers dump skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the individual who contributed the most has the highest analytical possibility of winning the whole swimming pool, though luck

can prefer low-tier factors.
