Privacy and "line of sight"

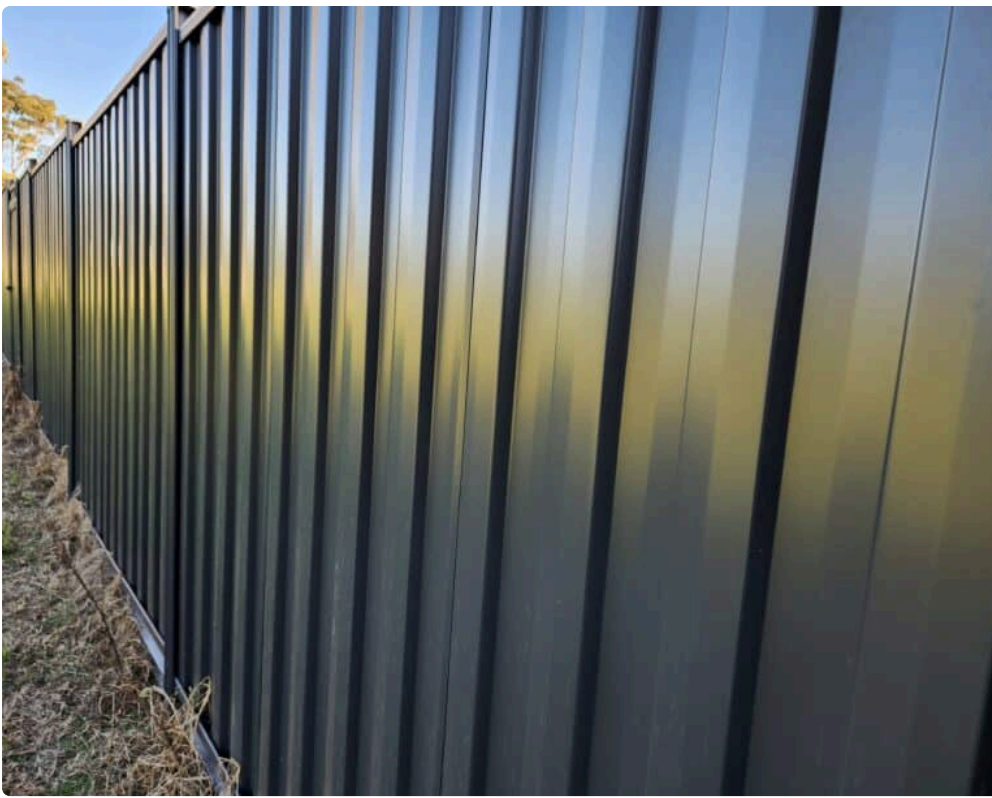
