Best Day Trips In 30 Minutes

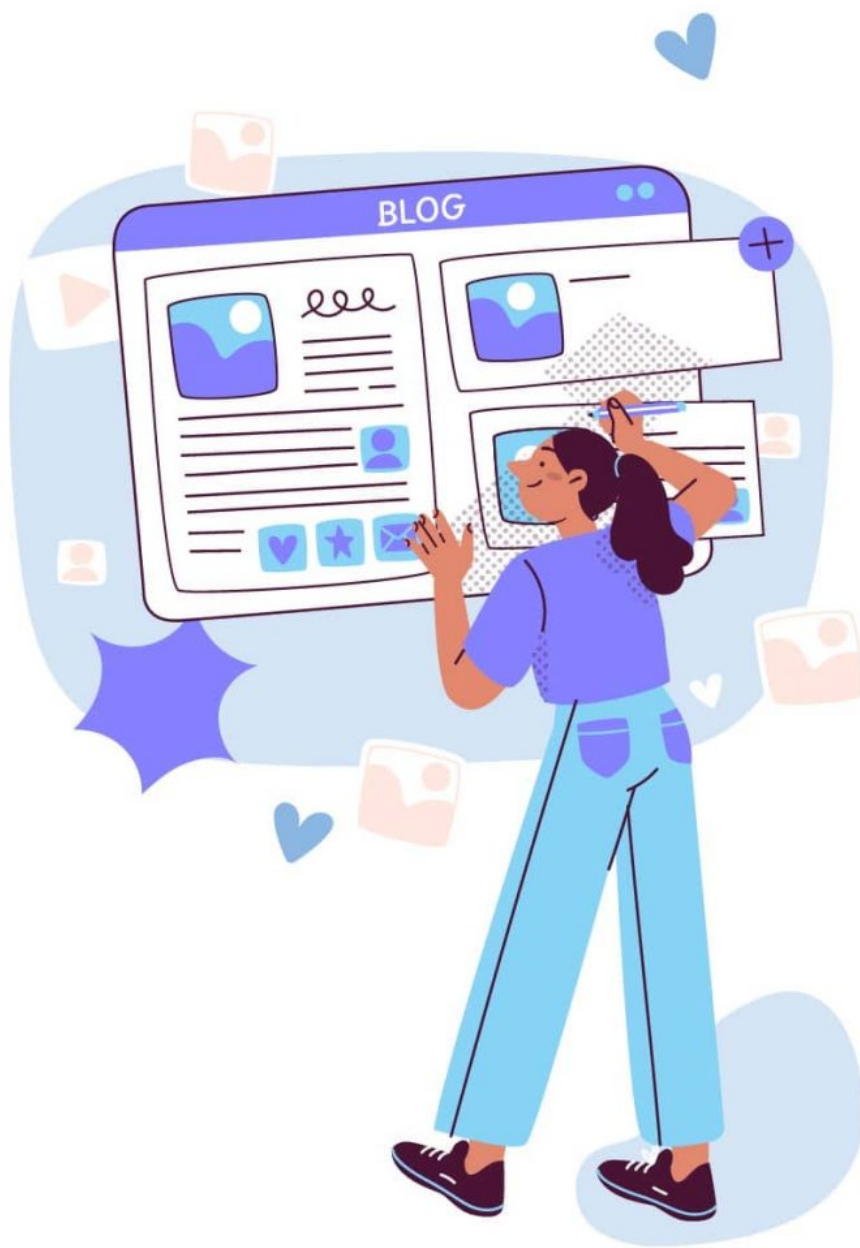
