

What garage door problems require expert service?

An overhead garage door is a large, heavy moving system that relies on balanced springs, lifting cables, rollers, tracks, hinges, and an operating mechanism. Professional garage door repair is usually appropriate when the door is making excessive noise, will not move, comes off its tracks, sags on one side, or stops partway open or closed.

Common problems include a broken garage door spring, damaged cables, worn rollers, a bent track, failed safety equipment, or a malfunctioning garage door opener. A damaged garage door panel may also need repair or replacement, especially if it affects the door's alignment, security, or ability to seal against weather.

Some issues are minor, but others can cause the door to fall, trap a vehicle, or damage the opener. A qualified technician can check the complete system rather than replacing one component without identifying the main source of the issue.



Why will an overhead garage door not open or close?

An overhead garage door that will not open or close may have a problem with the garage door opener, remote control, wall switch, power supply, or safety sensors. Misaligned safety sensors are frequent. These photo-eye devices sit near the floor on opposite sides of the door and must face each other with a clear path between them.

Check whether the remote control has a working battery and whether the opener has power. Look for objects blocking the sensors, blinking indicator lights, or dirt on the sensor lenses. A garage door track may also be bent, obstructed, or misaligned. The garage door tracks should remain properly secured and aligned so the rollers can travel smoothly.

If the opener runs but the door does not move, the drive gear, trolley, chain, belt, or connection between the opener and door may be damaged. A door that reverses immediately may indicate a sensor, balance, or force-setting problem. Do not repeatedly operate a door that is crooked, grinding, or stuck halfway; continued use can increase the problem.

When is a broken garage door spring be dangerous?

A broken garage door spring is dangerous because the springs counterbalance the garage door weight. A torsion spring is mounted above the door, while an extension spring is typically positioned along the horizontal tracks. Both store significant energy, even when the door seems motionless.

Signs of spring failure include a visible gap in the spring, a loose or dangling component, a door that feels extremely heavy, loud snapping sounds, or a door that rises only a few inches. Lifting cables may also detach when a spring fails. Never attempt to unwind, or reconnect a spring without specialized training and tools.
