

Average Garage Door Repair Cost in West Hollywood

The average garage door repair cost in West Hollywood is generally about **\$125 to \$450** for a regular service visit and small or medium-level repairs. Major repair work, damaged doors, and replacement work can raise the total to **\$500 to \$1,500 or more**.
