

Knoxville is one of those Southern cities that reveals itself slowly. On a first pass, visitors notice the easy skyline framed by the Smokies, the energy around the University of Tennessee, and the old brick buildings that give downtown its grounded feel. Spend a little more time here, and the city starts to show its layers.
