When all virtual seats at a table are occupied, players can still put wagers on the video game by betting behind one of the seated gamers.

How Bet Behind Works:

- You choose a seated gamer whose playing design or winning streak you trust.
- You put your wager in the "Bet Behind" circle related to that player.
- If the seated player wins their hand, you win your bet (payments match standard blackjack guidelines).
- **Key Caveat:** You normally do not make the strategic decisions (hit/stand) for the hand; you are riding the coattails of the seated player's options, though some tables allow you to make independent decisions relating to double downs or insurance coverage if you wager behind.
