- **The Martingale System:** A timeless wagering technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus an earnings equal to the initial base bet. However, this requires a huge bankroll and can quickly strike site wagering limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses minimized to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intention of claiming enormous multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This operates similar to playing the lottery game.
