- **4. Utilize Lower-Cost Cases for Longevity**Instead of blowing your whole spending plan on a single battle including pricey cases (like Operation cases or Dreams & Nightmares), opt for less expensive cases to play more rounds. This reduces variance and extends your gaming session.
