Fixing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

If CS2 is interrupting your matches, overcoming a structured troubleshooting procedure is the most effective way to find a repair.

1. Verify Game File Integrity

- Open Steam and browse to your **Library**.

- Ensure **Reflex Low Latency** is set to "Enabled + Boost" rather than triggering conflicts with your specific CPU.

4. Manage Overlays and Background Applications

Overlays are well-known for triggering hook conflicts with the Source 2 engine. Consider disabling:

- Discord Overlay
- Steam Overlay (Right-click CS2 in Steam > > Properties > > General > Enable the Steam Overlay while in-game -> >
- Toggle OFF)NVIDIA GeForce Experience Shadowplay/ In-Game Overlay
- Third-party overclocking and tracking software like MSI Afterburner or RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS).

- **Disable Fullscreen Optimizations:** Right-click the cs2.exe file (located in steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ video game \ bin \ win64), go to **Properties > > Compatibility, and examine**"Disable fullscreen optimizations. **"Run as Administrator: Give cs2.exe**
