Case Opening Mimics the in-game case opening experience, but frequently on third-party sites with custom-curated chances and higher-tier benefit swimming pools. Very variable; normally favors your house greatly.
Coinflip An uncomplicated 1v1 PvP video game where 2 players wager skins of roughly equal worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the entire pot. 50/50 odds, minus a little platform commission (rake).
Jackpot Several gamers contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes everything. Based upon the total value contributed; platform takes a portion fee.
