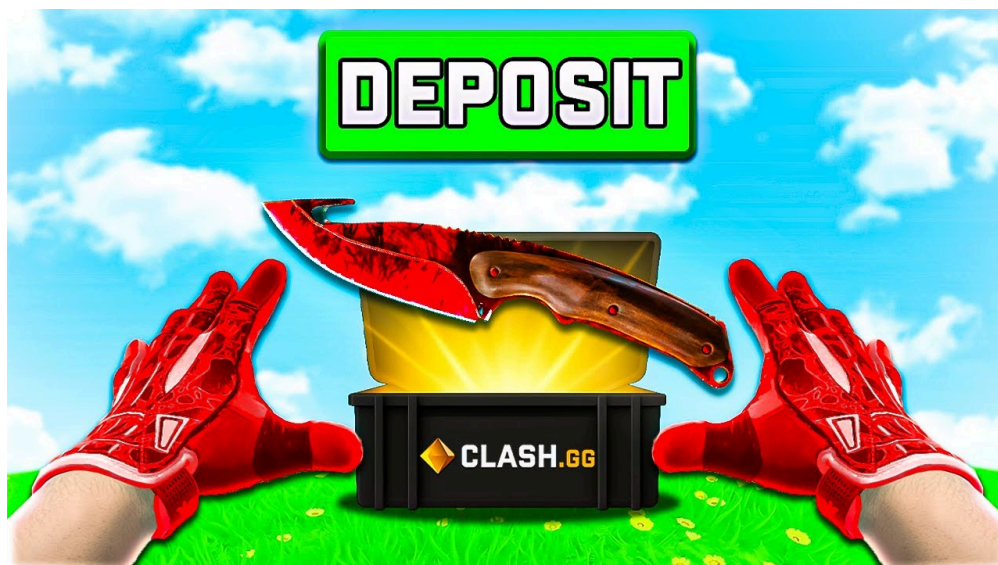

3. How to Acquire a CS2 Case

- In-game drops**-- After finishing a match, players have an opportunity to get a free CS2 case as a drop. The drop rate is relatively low (\approx 1% per match) and is affected by the player's performance and the map played.
- Purchase from the Steam Store**-- During unique promotions, Valve might offer cases directly for a repaired cost (frequently £ 2.49-- £ 2.99).
