4. **Event Giveaways**-- Occasionally, Valve or partner tournaments host giveaways where gamers can win an unusual case. Watching on official announcements and social networks channels makes sure opportunities are not missed out on.

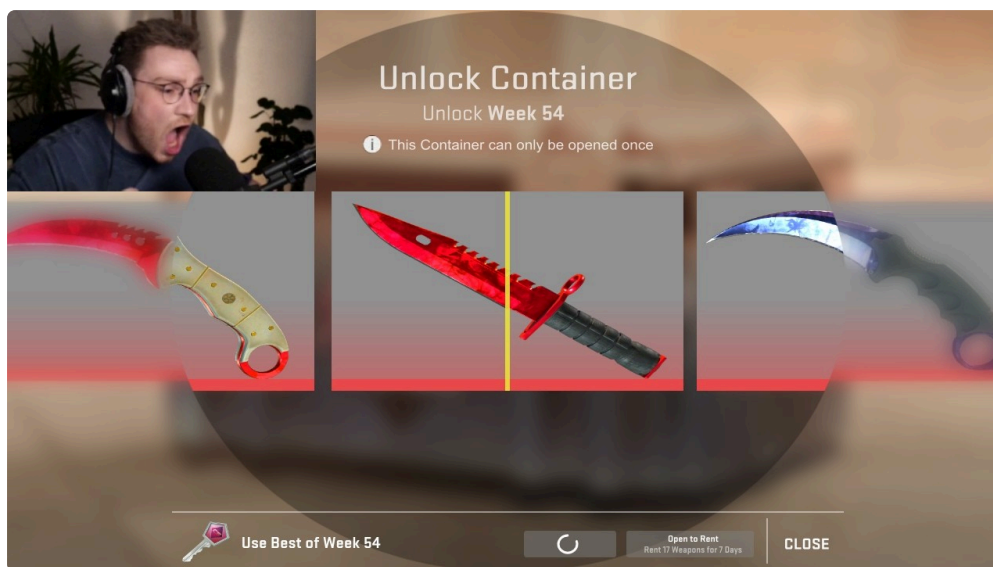
