Check with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA)

The FMCSA is the federal agency regulating interstate movers. They maintain an online database where you can perform a **licensing check** to ensure the mover is registered and compliant.

- Each interstate moving company should have a unique USDOT number.
- Use the FMCSA's website to verify the number matches the company name and check their safety records.
- Beware of companies that refuse to provide their USDOT number or claim they operate without one.

Request Insurance Proof
