If you are experiencing recurring crashes, work through the following troubleshooting actions methodically.

1. Confirm the Integrity of Game Files

Over time, video game files can become corrupted due to unexpected system shutdowns, insufficient updates, or defective storage drives. Steam has a built-in tool to examine and change missing or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **CS: GO** and choose **Properties**.
- Browse to the **Local Files** tab.
- Click **Verify Integrity of Game Files**.
- Await the procedure to finish (Steam will instantly download any corrupted files), then restart your computer system.

2. Update or Roll Back Graphics Drivers

- NVIDIA GeForce Experience Overlay
- RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) and MSI Afterburner

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard repairs stop working to deal with the problem, the problem may lie much deeper within your os or hardware configuration.

1. Managing Overclocks and XMP Profiles

While overclocking your CPU, GPU, or RAM offers a performance boost, CS: GO is notoriously conscious hardware instability.

- If you have actually used an aggressive overclock, try calling it back to standard factory specifications.
- If you are running high-speed RAM, test disabling your motherboard's **XMP (Extreme Memory Profile)** or **DOCP** in the BIOS to see if memory instability is causing the crashes.

- Uninstall CS: GO through Steam.
