

Common Garage Door Repair Cost in Los Angeles

The typical **garage door repair cost** in Los Angeles varies according to the failed component, the door's size and material, accessibility, and whether service is needed during standard business hours. Many residential repairs range from approximately \$150 and \$700, although a minor adjustment may cost less and a major opener, panel, or structural repair may cost considerably more.

Local **garage door repair pricing** commonly includes a service call fee, diagnostic inspection, repair labor, and parts and materials. Garage door repair Cost by Issue

- **Door springs:** Spring replacement often costs about \$200 to \$500, depending on the spring type, door weight, and required safety parts.

Garage Door Spring Replacement Cost

The **garage door spring cost** is often between \$200 and \$500 for a residential door, including standard repair labor. A single spring on a small, light door may be less expensive, while a heavy two-car garage door may

require two springs, upgraded hardware, or additional balancing work.

A **torsion spring** is mounted above the door opening and supports the door by winding and unwinding around a shaft. An **extension spring** is positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretches as the door moves. Garage Door Opener Repair and Installation Costs

A **garage door opener** may stop working because of a failed motor, worn gear, faulty circuit board, broken chain or belt, damaged wiring, sensor misalignment, or a defective **remote control**. **Garage door opener repair** commonly costs approximately \$100 to \$350, although replacement electronics or motor assemblies can increase the total.

The **garage door opener installation cost** is often around \$400 to \$1,200 for the equipment and installation process. The price is influenced by the opener’s lifting capacity, horsepower, battery backup, lighting, smart-home features, noise level, and **operating system**. Garage Door Replacement Cost Compared With Repairs

The **garage door replacement cost** for a typical residential door often falls from approximately \$1,000 to \$4,000 or more, including installation. Simple non-insulated steel doors may be at the lower end, while custom wood, high-insulation, architectural glass, impact-resistant, or highly decorative doors can cost considerably more.
