The **X storefront** takes a different approach, bundling voice with language, vision, and other AI services into "SuperGrok" plans. Free Tier: Demo, Not a Trial Plan — What You Need to Know

Many buyers expect the xAI free tier at grok.com to function as a "trial plan" with sizeable usage before paying. Instead, the free tier is more like a *demo mode*: it provides limited monthly minutes to test the realtime voice experience but isn't designed for extended production use.

Here's what the free tier includes:

- **Free minutes per account:** Typically under 200 minutes monthly, enough for small tests.
- **No rollover:** Unused minutes expire monthly.

- **Rate limits:** Real-time throttling of simultaneous API calls to ensure fair usage.

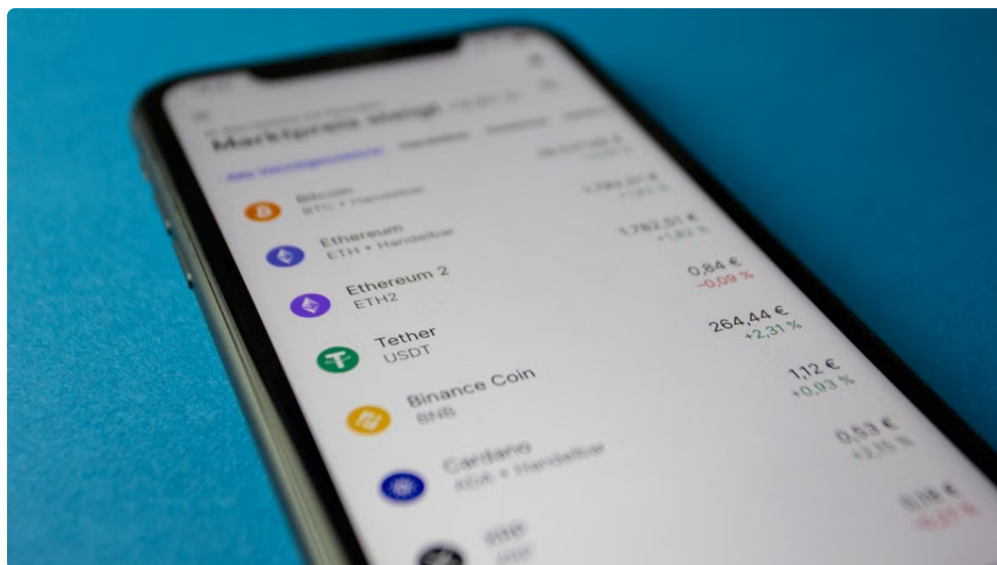
xAI's voice APIs, especially on the X storefront, come with hidden rate limits that can surprise users. Unlike grok.com's more transparent per-minute pricing and usage, X's bundled plans throttle usage to nudge users toward higher, more expensive tiers.

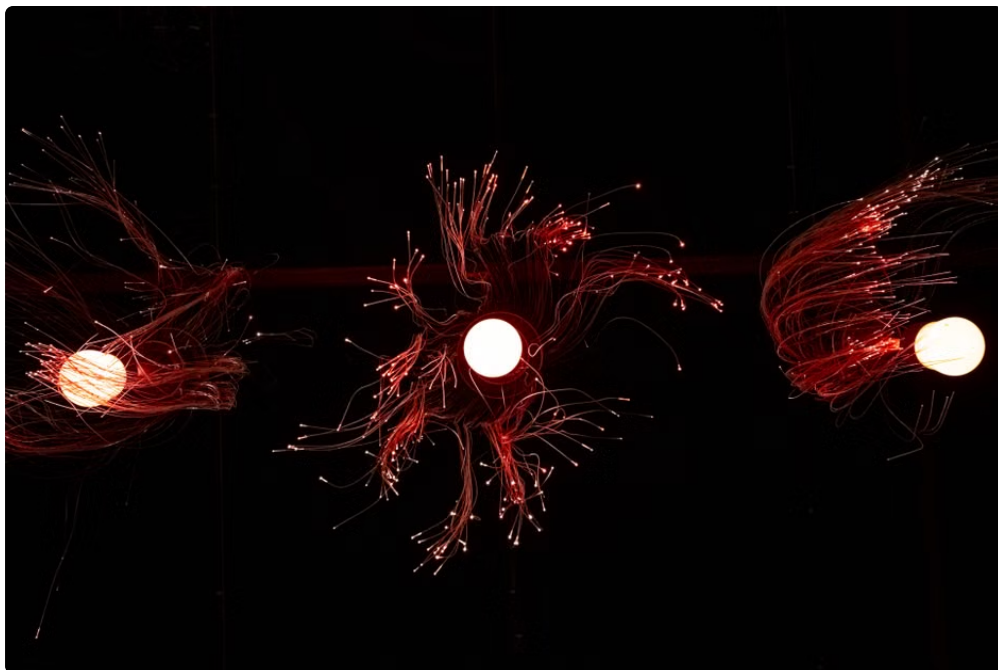
