4. Crazy Time

This is the ultimate perk round, accessed through a red door behind the main wheel. Gamers are transported into a lively, virtual world including a massive, vibrant wheel with 64 sectors and 3 flappers (Green, Blue, and Yellow). Players pick their flapper. The wheel spins, and whatever multiplier it stops on is granted. If it hits "Double" or "Triple," all multipliers increase, and the wheel spins again-- scaling as much as a shocking 20,000 x max win.
