- **Jackpot:** Multiple players pool their skins into a central pot. A timer counts down, and a random ticket is drawn. The higher the value of the skins a gamer contributes, the higher their statistical opportunity of winning the pot.
- **Plinko:** Inspired by the video game show, players drop a puck down a pegboard, landing in multipliers that either increase or decrease their preliminary bet.

Comparing Traditional Casinos vs. CS2 Gambling Sites

3. **The Nonce:** A counter that increases with every bet put.
4. **The Outcome:** The combination of the server seed, client seed, and nonce is run through an algorithm to create the video game result. After the round, the unencrypted server seed is exposed, enabling the gamer to individually confirm that the outcome was not altered mid-game.

Risks and Precautions
