The CS: GO crash site is rarely used for standard Premier or Competitive matches. Rather, its distinct geometry shines in alternative video game modes developed to test various capability.

- **Co-op Guardian Missions:** Introduced heavily throughout operations like *Operation Shattered Web* and *Operation Riptide*, players team up against waves of AI enemies equipped with significantly hard weaponry while defending the crash site.

4. Avoid Clustered Pushes:

- Because the freight hold funnels gamers into tight areas, pushing as a tight group makes the group susceptible to spam fire and explosive damage. Maintain appropriate spacing.
