As the table highlights, the odds of pulling a Covert item are less than 1%, and the odds of securing an uncommon Special product (a knife or a pair of gloves) hover around a meager **0.26%**-- roughly a 1-in-385 chance per case.

- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look amazing even at greater wear values, while others look heavily damaged. Knowing how float worths impact rate is essential if you mean to trade or sell your unboxed products.
