

Your building works after hours whether you light it or not

A commercial building is visible to more people at night than most owners assume. A dark building reads as closed, and in a quieter way it reads as not there. A lit one stays in the mental map of everybody who drives that road. None of this is decoration spending. A building that reads clearly at night is doing work every evening. It is one of the few exterior expenses that runs every night without further input.

The front of the building

The facade is legible from further away than lettering. Light the structure, not just the surface, so it becomes recognizable. Brand colors on the facade say something a static sign cannot.

The parts people touch

Poorly lit entries lose people quietly. Light the approach, the door and the step so it is obvious from the parking area. For restaurants, outdoor seating lives or dies on the lighting. Warm, low and glare free: the technique is identical, the stakes are not. Commercial lighting decisions also tend to outlast the people who make them, so it is worth writing down what was installed and why while everybody still remembers.

Neighborhood and community entrances

Community entries do a lot of work. Light on the entry structure and its landscaping signals that somebody looks after the place. Homeowners associations and developments run this as a standing property decision, not a seasonal one, though seasonal color at the entrance is a common addition.

Install timing

Technically, the job is not different from residential work. What changes is when the crew can be on site. No business wants scaffolding in front of the door during business hours, so the install is timed around when you are open.

Seasonal color without a seasonal contract

With permanent hardware, the display is software. Holiday colors in December. Orange in October. Team colors when the town cares about a game. A brand palette the rest of the year. No annual booking, no scheduling, no return visit.

From the car to the entrance

Between the parking space and the front door there is a walk somebody has to take. People notice a dark walk without ever saying so. Lighting the route does not photograph well, and it does more for how a business feels than the facade does. Worth saying: a commercial plan can be phased. Start where the return is most visible, then work inward toward where customers stand.

The next step

Every commercial building presents differently from the road, so the design starts on site. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
