- **Foggy Double-Paned Glass:** Indicates that the seal between the 2 panes has stopped working, permitting wetness and condensation to get caught within.

remain consistent. 1. **Security First** Damaged glass is naturally harmful. Anybody dealing with the repair needs to wear sturdy work gloves, protective eyeglasses, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is totally shattered, putting down a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work

- **from the frame. Clearing Residue:** Scrape away old silicone, putty,

or double-sided glazing tape. Wipe the rabbet(the recess where the glass sits) clean so the new glass will sit flush. 4. **Determining and Installing the Replacement Glass** Precise measurements are important.

- **Step the height, width, and density of the glass opening. Use a fresh bead of silicone sealant or brand-new**
- **glazing tape to the frame. Thoroughly set the brand-new piece of glass into the opening, pressing carefully to create a tight seal. Reinstall the stops, beads, or cut to protect the glass in place.**
