Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

1. Verify the Integrity of Game Files

- *Pro Tip:* If crashes began immediately after a driver update, utilize a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to totally wipe the old driver before setting up a clean variation.

3. Change Launch Options

Specific launch options can require the game to run in a more steady mode or bypass troublesome intro videos.

To set launch options:

1. Right-click CS: GO in Steam and choose **Properties**.
2. Under the **General** tab, discover the **Launch Options** text box.
3. Include the following recommended specifications:

5. Look For Hardware Overheating and Overclocking
